NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows

Part I: Undertaking by the First Party

Part II: Undertaking by the Second Party

- (a) Provide leadership that will ensure a safe, modern and reliable transport & building infrastructure;
- (b) Ensure responsive regulatory frameworks;
- (c) Ensure compliance to Legal Framework;
- (d) Improve Management of State Assets;
- (e) Improve Organisational Performance.





Part III: Notes on Strategic Directions

In specific terms, the Ministry will in the short- to medium-term record measurable achievements in the following areas:

- Aviation Transport Infrastructure constructed and upgraded
- Road Transport Infrastructure Constructed, Maintained and Upgraded
- Railway Transport Infrastructure Upgraded
- Railway Station Buildings and platforms at Oshakati.
- Port Infrastructure Constructed, Maintained and Upgraded.
- Legal Framework developed and reviewed.
- Compliance to ICAO & IMO Standards.
- Functional GRN Flats/ Complexes Management System.
- M+E System for SOEs on Oversight implemented.

Part IV: Reporting lines and requirements:

- The ED will be required to submit quarterly performance progress reports to the Minister;
- Minister will submit Quarterly Progress reports on performance of the ministry for submission to, and discussion with, H.E. the President, through the Rt. Hon. Prime Minister;
- The Minister undertakes to give feedback to the Deputy Minister and ED on the quarterly performance report;
- < The Minister further undertakes to provide leadership to ensure that annual performance report is prepared and submitted to the President a month after the end of the financial year;
- < H.E. the President commits to personally preside over the performance evaluation sessions of Ministers within two (2) months after the end of the financial year

This PA will run for 12 months coinciding with the financial year starting 1st April 2019 to 31st March 2020
