- AU Convention Cyber Security and Personal Data Ratified; and
- National Information Policy Finalised;

- 1. The ED will be required to submit quarterly performance progress reports to the Minister;
- Minister will submit Quarterly Progress reports on performance of the ministry for submission to, and discussion with, H.E. the President, through the Rt. Hon. Prime Minister;
- The Minister undertakes to give feedback to the Deputy Minister and PS on the quarterly performance report;
- < The Minister further undertakes to provide leadership to ensure that annual performance report is prepared and submitted to the President a month after the end of the financial year;
- H.E. the President undertakes to provide feedback on the performance evaluation of Ministers within two (2) months after the end of the financial year
