## Govt. receives over 28.5 mil for Covid-19

Government has received monetary contributions and pledges to the value of N\$ 28.5 million and in-kind donations worth 20.2 million, towards the National Disaster Fund account for COVID-19.

One such donation, was a N\$ 1 million from the SWAPO Party delivered by Secretary General. Hon. Sophia Shaningwa for Covid-19.

The Prime Minister expressed government's profound appreciation for the support rendered to the nation to confront the pandemic and stressed that it is only through unity of purpose that Namibia as a nation can conquer the insivible deadly enemy.

All monetary donations received are deposited in a special account for Covid -19, whose details are shown here below.

## LOCKDOWN EXTENDED

President Hage Geingob announced the extension of a full lockdown, to curb the spread of COVID-19, to the whole country until the 4 May 2020.

The lockdown will be from 17 April 2020 (Friday midnight) to 04 May 2020 (monday, midnight). The country will effectively reopen on 5 May 2020.

## Measures to combat the spread of Covid-19: Work from home period

Consistent with the announcement of the lockdown by the President, the Prime Minister has extended the permission to identified staff members to work from home. Hence, notice is given that:

Due to measures to curb the spread of Covid-19, all staff members are allowed to perform their work from home from 17 April (midnight) to 04 May 2020 (midnight).

Exceptions is made only to identify staff members rendering essential services at the Office. Such staff members will be issued with letters to facilitate their travel to and from work.

All staff members are urged to continue to perform their tasks, submit their outputs to their supervisors and to use technology devices to streamline work engagement.



## Protect yourself and others

Everyone needs to stay at home to help slow the spread of coronavirus. You should only leave your home to:

- Shop for essential food and household goods
- Attend medical appointments, collect medicine or other health products
- Care for children, older people or other vulnerable people
- Exercise outdoors within 2 kilometres of your home and only with people from your own household keeping 2 metres between you and other people
- Travel to work if you provide an essential service be sure to practice social distancing

## 'Nutritious food and safety' are key in the fight against Covid-19

Secretary to Cabinet Dr. George Simataa received a donation worth 40 000 portions of nutritious food from Mr. Ian Collard, CEO of Namib Mills, to boost the immune system of people who fell victim to the Corona-virus.

The food was originally donated towards the 30th Independence Anniversary.

The donation consist of; three (3) pellets totaling 2.9 tons of Top Score Maize Meal and three (3) pellets totaling 1.3 tons of Polana Macaroni.

"The mission of Namib Mills is to feed the nation, and we, therefore, want to ensure there is constant supply of food products", said Mr. Collard.

"Nutritious food is important to boost the immune system and our Top Score is fortified with vitamins," he added.

Dr. Simataa commended Namib Mills for supporting government in the fight against the Corona-virus pandemic and called on private sector to come on board to ensure that reliable and effective testing can be done particularly at the border posts.

The two agreed that by working together on these times of uncertainty, the Government, private sector and public at large can prevent Namibia from experiencing the escalation of the Corona-virus pandemic.

Simataa and Collard further agreed that it is very unfortunate that the 30th Independence Celebrations have been postponed, but said that it is more important to guarantee the safety of the people.

## PM inspects a Covid-19 isolation centre built in a week

Prime Minister (PM) Dr. Saara Kuugongelwa-Amadhila (centre in the picture) inspected a newly built isolation facility at the Windhoek Central Hospital (WCH), on 01 April 2020. The isolation facility built in one week has 12 fully furnished self-contained rooms for the Covid -19 patients.

In addition, government through the Ministry of Health and Social Services converted a section of the WCH into an ICU and a High Care Centre with 6 beds and 9 beds respectively for Covid -19 patients. There are 65 facilities around the country with a total capacity of 1500.

PM also inspected various Katutura locations in Windhoek including; Single Quarters, Katutura central, Soweto, Wanaheda and Havana to satisfy herself with how communities are complying with the lockdown measures.





### Did you know why are there bumps on the F and J keyboard keys?
