SECTION I: INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

1. Rights of Public Entity

The Office of the Prime Minister reserves the right:

- (a) to split the contract as per the lowest evaluated cost per item, or
- (b) to accept or reject any quotation; and
- (c) to cancel the quotation process and reject all quotations at any time prior to contract award.

2. Preparation of Quotations

You are requested to quote for the items mentioned in Section III by completing, signing and returning:

- (a) the Quotation Letter in Section II with its annex for Bid Securing Declaration]
- (b) the List of Goods and Price Schedule Section III;
- (c) the Specifications and Compliance Sheet in Section V; and
- (d) any other attachment deemed appropriate.

You are advised to carefully read the complete Request for Sealed Quotations document, including the Special Conditions of Contract in Section VII, before preparing your quotation. The standard forms in this document may be retyped for completion but the Bidder is responsible for their accurate reproduction.

3. Validity of Quotations

The Quotation validity period shall be 30 days from the date of submission deadline.

4. Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible to participate in this Quotation exercise, you should:

- (a) have a valid company Registration Certificate;
- (b) Attach detailed quotation on a company letterhead.
- (c) Be in line with its business principle.
- (b) have an original valid good Standing Tax Certificate;
- (c) have an original valid good Standing Social Security Certificate;
- (d) have a valid certified copy of Affirmative Action Compliance Certificate, proof from Employment Equity Commissioner that bidder is not a relevant employer, or exemption issued in terms of Section 42 of the Affirmative Action Act, 1998;
- (e) have a certificate indicating SME Status.
- (f) Completed, Signed Bid-securing Declaration
- (g) Completed, Signed Written Undertaking on the part of the Bidder that the salaries and wages payable to its personnel in respect of this proposal are compliant to the relevant laws, Remuneration Order, and Award, where applicable and that it will abide to sub-clause 4.6 of the General conditions of Contract if it is awarded the contract or part thereof; and;

5. Bid Securing Declaration

Bidders are required to submit a Bid Securing Declaration for this procurement process.

6. Delivery

Delivery shall be 2 weeks after acceptance/issue of Purchase Order. Deviation in delivery period shall be considered if such deviation is reasonable.

The following tests and inspections will be conducted on the goods at delivery:

- (a)Substandard products
- (b)Deviation in specifications given

7. Sealing and Marking of Quotations

Quotations should be sealed in a single envelope, clearly marked with the Procurement Reference Number, addressed to the Public Entity with the Bidder's name and contact information at the back of the envelope.

8. Submission of Quotations

Quotations should be delivered at the old Ministry of Industrialisation and Trade Building, Goethe Street, Ground Floor: North Wing, Office number: 017, on or before 16 April 2025 at 10am.

Late quotations will be rejected.

Quotations received by e-m'ail will not be considered.

9. Opening of Quotations

Quotations will be opened internally by the Office of the Prime Minister immediately after the closing time referred to in instruction 8 above. A record of the Quotation Opening stating the name of the bidders, the amount quoted, the presence or absence of a Bid Securing Declaration, will be posted on the website of the Office of the Prime Minister and available to any bidder on request within three working days of the Opening.

10. Evaluation of Quotations

The Office of the Prime Minister shall have the right to request for clarifications in writing during evaluation. Offers that are substantially responsive shall be compared on the basis of price or ownership cost, subject to Margin of Preference where applicable, to determine the lowest evaluated quotation.

11. Technical Compliance

Bidders shall submit along with their quotations documents, catalogues and any other literature to substantiate compliance with the required specifications and to qualify deviations if any with respect to Office of the Prime Minister's requirements.

The Specifications, Performance Requirements and Compliance Sheet details the minimum specifications of the goods/items to be supplied. The specifications have to be met but no credit will be given for exceeding the specifications.

12. Prices and Currency of Payment

Prices shall be fixed in Namibian Dollars.

- 4.1. All hardware and software tendered for should be delivered by the successful Bidder accompanied by their respective original documentation, including manuals and software media.
- 4.2.
