The Ministry of Information and Communication Technology (MICT) hosted the National ICT Summit Minister's sponsorship breakfast meeting on 4 June 2024 in Windhoek. The sponsorship breakfast meeting aims at introducing this year's sponsorship packages to ICT stakeholders, allowing them to make pledges.

The National ICT Summit is an annual event hosted since 2014. The Summit aims to bring together industry stakeholders to deliberate on emerging trends and challenges affecting the industry, globally and locally. ICT industry players also use the platform to showcase ICT-related services and networking.

The corporates who attended the event pledged

about N\$600 000. This year's summit will be held from 9-11 September 2024 under the theme: "Building Resilience to 'Adapt or Die' in the Era of Digital Transformation ad Artificial Intelligence (AI)". A number of sponsors also came on board after the breakfast meeting for pledges.

This year's summit ought to bring together policymakers, business fraternity and youth innovators, among others, to learn from one another through exchange of ideas and insights on emerging developments.

"The emergence of digital transformation and AI presents us with numerous opportunities. It has the potential to revolutionise industries, enhance efficiencies and improve the lives of our citizens," says ICT Minister Emma Theofelus.

Govt shares information, engages spokespeople at Opuwo

he government, through the Ministry of Information and Communication Technology (MICT), held an information-sharing session and engaged communication professionals at Opuwo in Kunene Region from 19 to 21 June 2024.

The three-day event, held under the theme "Improved service delivery

the public sector through communication," brought together over 100 communicators from different Ministries. Regional Councils, Local Authorities as well as from Public Enterprises. information-sharing session brought government services closer to the people of Opuwo and surrounding area.

The event allowed public entities to share information and display products and services they offer while interacting with the public.

"This vital initiative brings government services closer to our people and fosters transparent dialogue between the government and the citizens it serves. This session is a demonstration of our dedication to the principles of the Access to Information," says the ICT Ministry's Executive Director, Dr Audrin Mathe, in a speech read on his behalf by ICT Development Director Linda Aipinge-Nakale.

The engagement is in line with the 2022 Government Communications Strategy that aims to coordinate the dissemination of government information to the public. The Strategy calls on communicators to be pro-active in providing information to people.

The engagement will entail capacity building programmes to Government's enhance communication efforts to service delivery improve public sector the through communication. The engagement will be extended to other regions in the near future with the aim

of bringing services closer to the masses.

The Access to Information Act gives individuals right to access to information held by public authorities, and the public authorities are required to comply with its provisions to provide for requests for access to information.

Speaking at the information sharing session on 19 June 2024 at Opuwo, ICT Minister Emma Theofelus said the event aimed allow government entities engage effectively with the public, develop implement robust communication strategies, communities inform the various services and programmes as well as build mechanisms for collectina analysing and public feedback.

"To the community of Opuwo, I encourage you to seize this opportunity, engage with the various government institutions and gather all the information you require. Your active participation is invaluable, and your feedback will help us to improve our services and to better respond to your needs," Theofelus said.

In the same vein, Secretary to the Cabinet Dr George Simataa called upon all Public Relations Officers (PROs) to proactively ensure that the nation is kept abreast of the government activities and continuously engage the media on matters concerning their respective institutions.


