We are incredibly proud of this partnership with Huawei, a global leader in technology and innovation. We recognise Huawei not merely as a technology provider but as a true development partner. Your commitment to human capital development, infrastructure expansion, and knowledge transfer is both commendable and inspiring.

Hence the Universal Service and Access Fund which in this financial year has received 40 million to expand infrastructure to compliment the work of MNOs.
- 3. Training and Capacity Building: Through programmes like LEAP, and through ongoing collaboration with our partners, we seek to build a strong, skilled, and competitive ICT workforce. We welcome industry-led initiatives that complement our efforts in upskilling and professional development.
- 4. Innovation Ecosystems: We envision a Namibia where start-ups thrive, where innovation is supported, and where our youth perceive ICT not only as a field of study but as a field of opportunity. We call upon our partners to assist us in building incubators, innovation hubs, and centres of excellence.

The journey ahead is filled with both challenges and opportunities. However, with unity of purpose and partnership, we can ensure that Namibia is not left behind in the fourth industrial revolution. Tonight, as we celebrate the achievements and ambitions of Huawei and its partners, let us remember that technology is not an end in itself.
